BRIEF COURSE DESCRIPTION

Corruption is widely recognised as a major obstacle to development and legitimate democratic governance. Held for the fourth time in 2008, this intensive advanced course addresses critically the challenges of integrity reform and strategic corruption control. Drawing on interdisciplinary academic perspectives and lessons learned from practice, this course represents one of the few targeted, applied and yet conceptually grounded efforts currently available internationally for the analysis of corruption and anti-corruption. Topics covered include cross-cutting issues such as definitions, measurements and research methodology, and also distinct areas such as access to information, fiscal transparency, and risk assessment and management.

The course will be divided into two tracks: morning sessions will be devoted to crosscutting issues and skills and perspectives relevant for all participants, while the afternoons will be dedicated to Policy Labs, creating a forum for the in-depth analysis of four thematic areas that will allow for further specialization and expert discussion in a small group format.

The Policy Labs on offer are:

1. *Applied Legal Skills for Integrity Reform and Anti-Corruption*
2. *Fiscal Transparency and Corruption Risks (in partnership with the Local Government and Service Reform Initiative, OSI)*
3. *Governance of Natural Resource Revenues*
4. *Integrity in Reconstruction Aid and Programming (in partnership with the Network for Integrity in Reconstruction)*

The course is aimed at managers, internal control specialists, civil society organizations as well as advanced PhD students and academics developing similar courses at their own universities.

Information for fee-paying participants

- *The fee for the course is 1000 EUR/ 10 days for those employed by government agencies and international organizations.*
- *The fee for the course is 500 EUR/ 10 days for students, academics, researchers and those employed by the non-profit sector.*
- *Financial aid in forms of reduced fees, fee waivers and financial assistance can be applied for.*
