**BRIEF COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Interest in moral intuitionism has rapidly increased in recent years, with the appearance of a plethora of new arguments defending and attacking various aspects of this philosophical outlook. The goal of this course is to examine two aspects of moral intuitionism prominent in contemporary debates: (a) the epistemology of (moral) intuitions and (b) the role of intuitions in ethical inquiry. While we examine these questions in the contemporary setting, we also look at the historical development of ethical intuitionism in the works of Ross, Sidgwick and Moore. A sample of the issues addressed is: how are (non-moral and moral intuitions) justified, the self-evidence of moral intuitions, disagreement on moral questions, and conflicting moral intuitions.

Applications are invited from PhD students, post-doc fellows, researchers, and junior faculty. Advanced MA candidates will be considered only in exceptional cases.
